

Potential Impacts on Carbon Emissions


IEA estimated that Urban area consumes 67% of total energy and is responsible for over 70% emissions

- Public service: large scale infrastructure construction
- Housing: 1.8-2.0b m² new residential buildings built annually
- Employment pressure
- Lifestyle change: more electronic appliance
- Energy mix: biomass to commercial energy
- Environmental impacts including carbon emissions






Estimation of Energy-related CO₂ Emission (1990-2010)





Top Fossil Fuel Emitters (Absolute)

Top four emitters in 2012 covered 58% of global emissions China (27%), United States (14%), EU28 (10%), India (6%)



With leap year adjustment in 2012 growth rates are: China 5.6%, USA -4.0%, EU -1.6%, India 7.4%.

 - Migrant workers: over 200 million living in urban area, another 200 million migrants are coming




Vehicle Ownership vs. GDP per Capita



Energy Use in Buildings

- Existing buildings stock: about 50b m²
- New buildings: about 2.0b m² built annually
- Energy Use in buildings: about 20% of total commercial energy use, still low comparing to 1/3 in developed countries
