## Community Integration - why?

- Social "Licence to Operate"
-Social risk now a potentially high risk factor
-Employment \& provisioning issues
-Peaceful work conditions v civil unrest
-Who takes over what on closure?
-Future approvals


## Communities building partnerships

- Porgera (PNG) - Education, vocational training, health services, sports facilities, infrastructure, a new town, small business development, womens' groups.
:Freeport (Irian Jaya) - Small business development targetting mine site provisioning
- Anglo American mines (South Africa) - AIDS programs
-Kumtor (Kyrgystan) - Training, small scale village-based projects, local health facilities, models of best-practice
-Ranger, Osborne, Granny Smith (Australia) - Training, employment \& mentoring of aboriginals, promotion of intercultural awareness. aboriginal heritage research


## Community Integration \& Impact Minimisation Programs

- Early Discussion with local community reps
-Ongoing dialogue
-Identify areas of interest for joint projects
-Establish a Community Steering Committee
- Involve as many as possible in the projects
$\bullet$-Funding issues
- Develop \& implement a Sustainable Community Plan


## Benefits of Community Integration

-Corporate Social Responsibilityl Sustainability - the new ethic (Johannesburg Summit)
-Development must now be seen to have a clear social benefit to the community
-If well designed can enhance benefits to company \& shareholders as well as community
-Politics, future opportunitieslapprovals, risk minimisation
