




Why is Asia-Pacific cooperation important?






The Size of the World Economy Incremental Growth coming from East Asia




Asia-Pacific Diversity: Land Area KM2 (000s)













Converging Views? Yes on regulatory transparency

Asian Track


- Post Asian-crisis response to weak support from APEC and major partners

- Sustain US economic engagement in the region.


Challenge is how, the two tracks can provide pathways toward a truly free regional trading system.

DECCO Income Gains from Regional Trade Initiatives








What do you think is the likelihood of success in concluding the following proposed agreements over the next 3 years?






