Trade turnover in 2015 = USD 80 bln.

Russia

Population = 143.5 mln.

GDP = USD 2.0 trln.

China

Population = 1.3 bln.

GDP = USD 9.2 trln.

Trade turnover in 2020 (projected) = USD 200 bln.

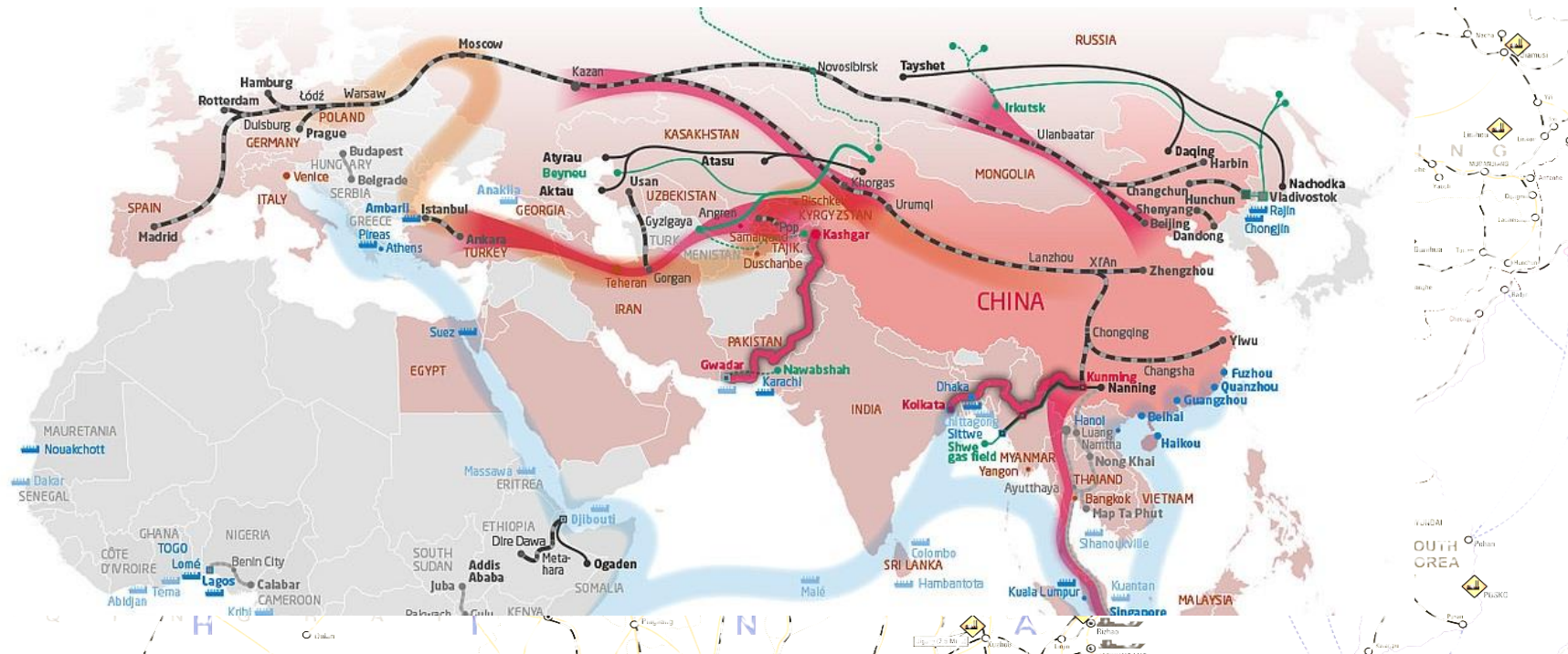

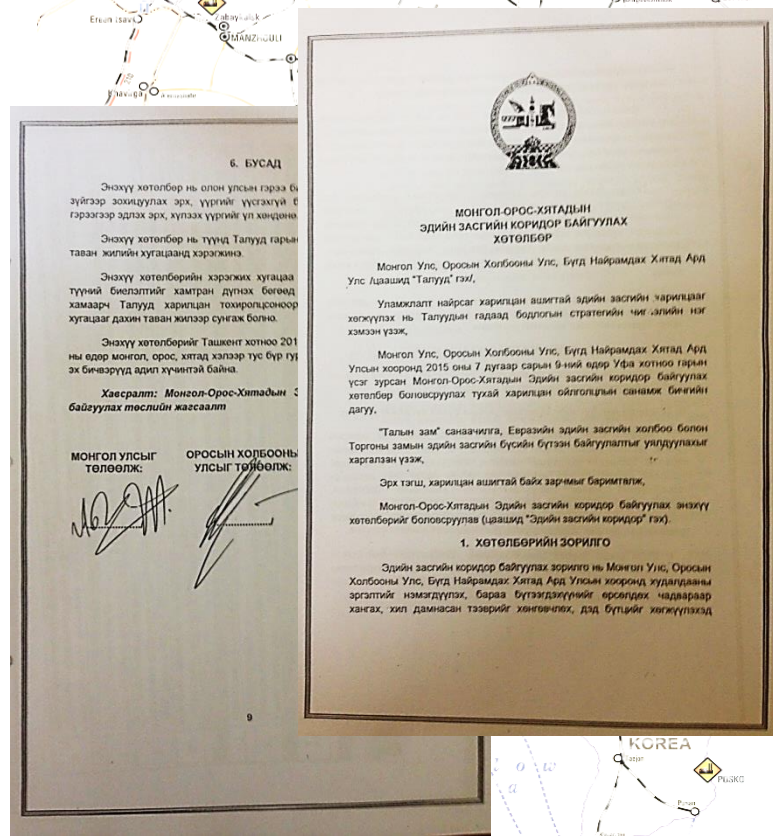

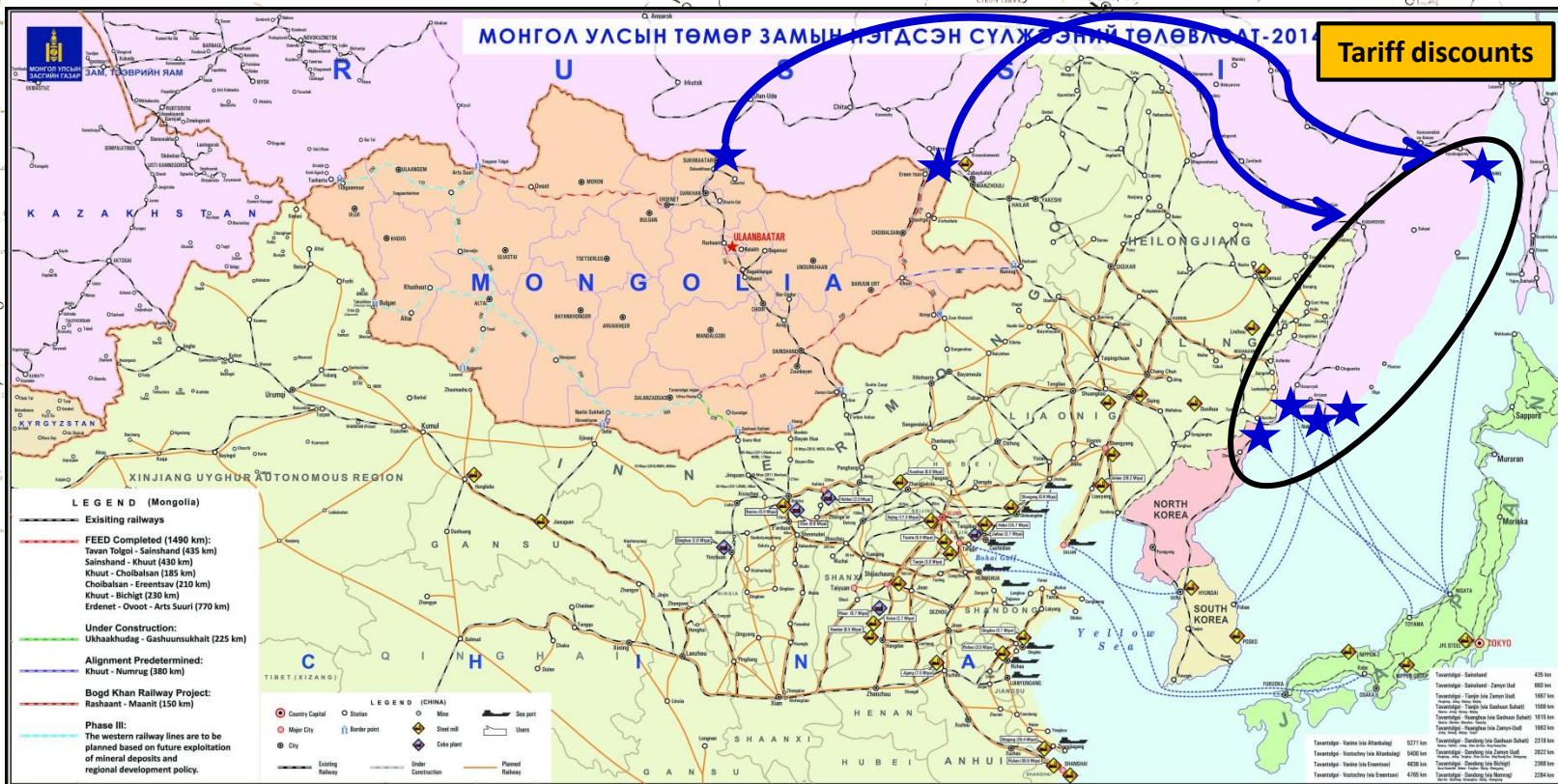
