



The Council of Canadians

"In Canada, concerns with the TPP include: how it could lead to the dismantling of Canada's important supply management regimes for dairy, poultry and egg production; the race-to-the-bottom potential in a proposed regulatory harmonization chapter; extreme intellectual-property protections for big drug companies that would limit access to lifesaving medicines; investor-state provisions that would allow companies to sue governments over rules to protect the environment; government procurement restrictions, and copyright rules that undermine internet freedom."
