1. Strategic Change in Trade Policy?

- Japan is a late comer on the FTA band-wagon and never an aggressive FTA proponent
- Different in motivation and feasibility
- Only one being negotiated, while others are still at the stage of proposal: no real effect of discrimination

2. Japan-Korea FTA

- Proposed by the two leaders: October 1998-March 1999
- •IDE/KIEP Joint Study completed in May 2000
- •Comprehensive package aiming at dynamic gains through intensified intra-industry specialization and industrial and financial cooperation: to revitalize the two economies
- •KIEP report expected 'pre-FTA measures' to be taken by Japan to improve public feeling
- Economic Agenda 21 proposed tax treaty (1999), investment treaty (being negotiated), and MRA and IPR (on the agenda)
- J-K Business Forum established to follow up

3. Japan-Singapore FTA

- Agreed by two leaders : December 1999
- Joint study team was set up comprising of business, academic, and officials: completed in November 2000
- Economic Partnership Agreement: comprehensive coverage including liberalization, ROO and other facilitation, bilateral cooperation, and dispute settlement
- •Negotiation started and will be completed within 2001
- Pioneer or experimental attempt with least resistance by agricultural sector

4. Japan-Mexico FTA

- Joint study conducted by JETRO and SECOFI: published in April 2000 (Closer Economic Relations between J and M)
- Japan defensively motivated so as to eliminate discrimination Japanese firms face against American and European firms resulting from the abolishment of maquiladora program
- Special considerations for Japanese domestic issues mentioned
- •Momentum increased to start negotiation by the recent visit of President Fox

5.Pragmatic Policy Shift in Response toCompetitive Liberalization

- •FTAs proposed by Canada, Chile, and Australia
- •Aims at the revitalization of the economy through liberalization, facilitation, and structural reform
- Seeks for high-level FTAs: consistent with APEC's open regionalism
- •Promote other regional cooperation in parallel: Japan-Korea-China
- ASEAN plus Three, and APEC
- Promotion of the WTO liberalization in parallel
